





Kampagne #IdentifyMe Unknown dead woman by the motorway A6 near Heidelberg

CRIME: MURDER

FACTS OF THE CASE:

Heidelberg public prosecutor's office and Heidelberg Criminal Investigation Department Directorate request your assistance!

On 16/03/1986, the body of a woman was discovered in close proximity to a car park of the federal motorway A 6 (in the direction of Heilbronn), St. Leon-Rot (Rhein-Neckar district, Baden-Württemberg). To date, the woman's identity has not been established.

The woman was the victim of violent crime. At the time of her death possibly spring/autumn 1985 she is believed to have been 27 to 33 years old

REWARD:

For any information leading to the solving of the crime and identification of the person who committed it, Heidelberg public prosecutor's office offers a reward of EUR 5,000.

For any information leading to the identification of the unknown dead woman a reward of EUR 2,000 is offered.

Only private individuals are entitled to the reward. Officers whose professional duties involve the investigation and prosecution of criminal acts are not entitled to it. The reward will be granted and distributed without recourse to legal action.

PERSONAL DETAILS:

Sex: female

Age: 27 - 33 years

APPEARANCE:

- European appearance
- has denture (upper jaw; see picture)







CLOTHING:

- bordeaux-coloured trousers and a light-red T shirt, size of clothes not known (see picture)
- white casual shoes, size 36 (see picture)
- thin leather anklet around left foot
- finger ring (made of three woven gold-, silver- and bronze-coloured wires; see picture)

FURTHER INFORMATION RELATING TO THIS SEARCH MATTER:

Place of discovery: near a car park of the federal motorway A 6 near St Leon Rot (Rhein Neckar district), Baden-Württemberg

At the request of Heidelberg public prosecutor's office, Freiburg Institute of Forensic Medicine reconstructed the woman's face in 2009.

In 2011, isotope analysis of the dead woman's bones, teeth and hair provided information about her place of origin and/or last whereabouts in her lifetime.

According to the findings of these isotopic analyses, the woman might possibly

- have changed her place of residence and/or whereabouts several times, might have lived in the Benelux countries (Luxembourg, Belgium, the Netherlands) for quite some time
- might have stayed in the United Kingdom during the last ten months of her life.
- The victim's blood group is A.

Investigators specifically wish to know:

Can you provide information about the identity of the unknown dead woman?
